GRAMMAR

<u>The 1° Conditional</u> has the present simple after 'if', then the future simple in the other clause: (if + present simple, ... will + infinitive). It is used to talk about things which might happen in the future. Of course, we cannot know what will happen in the future, but this describes possible things, which could easily come true. <u>The 2° Conditional</u> uses the past simple after 'would' and the infinitive: (if + past simple, ... would + infinitive) It is possible to use 'were' instead of 'was' with 'l' and 'he/she/it'. This is mostly done in formal writing. It has two uses. First, we can use it to talk about things in the future that are probably not going to be true
