The passive : be+ past participle

The passive is used when it's not said, known, or important who does an action.

If you want to say who did the action, use by:

It is possible to say things in two ways, in the active or in the passive Example: Batman Begins *was directed by Christopher Nolan*

Cristopher Nolan directed Batman Begins

It is possible to form negatives and questions in the same way as in active sentences.

It is used passive form to talk about processes, for example scientific process, and informational writing, such as newspaper report.
